Flu and Covid-19 Vaccination Clinics

Our seasonal flu vaccination campaign launched on 1 October 2025 with a busy first clinic, where we vaccinated **821 patients for flu and 575 eligible patients for COVID-19**, alongside other routine vaccinations. The clinic ran from 08:00 to 18:00, and we were also able to complete a number of outstanding patient reviews during the day. A second clinic was held on Saturday 4 October from 08:00 to 12:00, where we vaccinated a **further 460 patients for flu and 232 for COVID-19**. At our Tuesday 7 October clinic, we delivered **648 flu and 310 COVID-19 vaccinations**.

Vaccinations for our **housebound and care home patients began during the week commencing 6 October**, and we are currently organising an additional clinic to make use of any remaining vaccine stock.

Separate clinics are also being held for nasal flu vaccinations for children aged 2 to 3. A huge thank you to all of our staff and our Patient Group for their support in delivering such a successful campaign.

Pride in Practice, delivered by the LGBT Foundation, works with healthcare providers to embed LGBTQIA+ inclusion into everyday care and improve patient experience.

Reflecting on the award, Simon Stitson, Practice Business Manager, said:

"We are really proud to receive a Gold Award under the Pride in Practice Programme and welcomed the opportunity to enhance the services and support we offer to our LGBTQIA+ patients and staff.

We valued the support of the LGBT Foundation in helping us to review our policies, and to update the support information and links on our practice website. As a team, we completed an interactive training programme which helped us understand some of the barriers and challenges our LGBTQIA+ patients may face when accessing healthcare services, and how we can better support them.

Face to Face Appointment Data Update

GPAD data for the period **25.08.2025** to **21.09.2025**

- **6,506 appointments** of which **4,746** were face to face **(72.94%)** and **1,760** were telephone **(27.05%)**.
- The Did Not Attend rate was 4.2% (274 appointments)
- 1522 appointments were with a GP, of which 1,446 were face to face (95%) and 56 were by telephone (3.6%).
- 3,605 appointments were provided on the same day.
- Nationally, **63%** of all appointments at GP practices were carried out face to face in July 2025.

The Friends and Family Test

Our updated Friends and Family Test feedback scores for April and May are as follows:

June 2025 - 314 surveys submitted, 92.35% Good or Very Good
July 2025 - 313 surveys submitted, 94.56 % Good or Very Good
August 2025 - 281 surveys submitted, 93.58% Good or Very Good
September 2025 - 323 surveys submitted, 95.65% Good or Very Good

Looking at the last rolling 12 months (October 2025 to September 2025), we received **3,747 completed surveys with 92.58% Good or Very Good**

An Update from our Social Prescribing Team


